

Human Trafficking 101

What does modern day human trafficking really mean and how can YOU help combat it?

The San Francisco Collaborative Against Human Trafficking (SFCaHT), the San Francisco Human Rights Commission (HRC) and the Alameda County District Attorney's Office invite the public to two educational forums on what modern day human trafficking means and how private citizens can combat it through the choices they make every day.

What kinds of jobs, industries and socio-economic conditions lend themselves to human trafficking? What other criminal businesses are related to human trafficking?

How do we combat human trafficking and provide support to its victims? What laws exist to fight human trafficking? What is the role of government, law enforcement and the judiciary? What is the role of non-profit organizations? What is the role of private citizens?
