## Jonathan Fung Art Exhibit Before Our Very Eyes

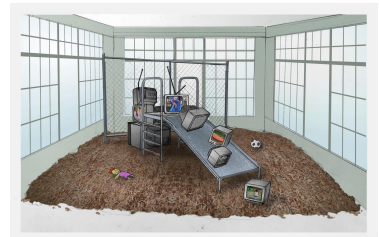
